Campfires

- **ONLY** light a campfire when the Fire Danger rating is **LOW** or **MODERATE***
- When allowed, fires may be started no earlier than 6pm and must be extinguished before 2am
- All outdoor fires **MUST** be under the care & control of a competent person at all times
- All fires must have adequate control immediately available (i.e a bucket of sand / water or a hose)

Fireworks

- Fireworks are ONLY allowed on Victoria Day,
 Canada Day (July 1st) and Independence Day
 (July 4th), and the one day immediately
 preceding or following these holidays
- If Fire Danger Rating is "High" or "Extreme"
 FIREWORKS ARE NOT ALLOWED*
- All Fireworks displays MUST be under the care & control of a competent person and suitable fire extinguishing equipment must be available
- Firecrackers and Sky Lanterns are banned within the Township of the Archipelago

*To report open burning or fireworks at improper times, contact the **By-Law officer (705-774-3630)** and let them know the municipal address or location so they can respond

Fire Response

Call 9-1-1

- For a building fire or if your cottage is threatened by a forest fire, call 911 and provide the municipal address closest to the fire (consult your Crane Lake Map for the address if the fire is not on your property)
- Fire Fighters from Seguin Township will arrive by water. If available volunteers on Crane may arrive too.

Fire Pumps & AED


- Check your Crane Lake Map and familiarize yourself with the 5 locations around the lake that have a Fire Pump and an AED
- The Crane Lake Fire Boat at the Marina has an AED and a heavy duty Fire Pump. At least 3 people are required to operate the Fire Pump on the boat and use the hose(s)

Water safety is important for all of us to continue to enjoy the lake. To protect the environment and stay safe check out the tips below:

Water Safety Do's

- Practice safe boating by respecting all neighbours and the environment
- When travelling within 30
 metres (99 feet) of the shoreline,
 keep your speed to under 10
 km/hr while driving your boat
- Look for environmentally safe soaps and cleaning products to use inside as they eventually make their way back to the lake
- Rinse your boat whenever you trailer it to or from another body of water to reduce the chance of importing invasive species

Water Safety Don'ts

- Don't fertilize your plants or lawn at the cottage
- Don't use soaps, shampoos, or conditioners in the lake, even if marketed as safe to do so; they are not
- Don't use chemicals to wash your boat while in the water.
 Trailer it to land away from the water to clean it
- Don't allow any gas to spill into the lake while refueling boats and watercraft
